John MacArthur’s Dad, “Jack” MacArthur, was on the extended staff at Moody Bible

In “The Voice of Calvary Legacy,” John MacArthur stated that his father, in addition to being the Director of the Fuller Evangelistic Foundation, “served on the Extension Staff of Moody Bible Institute.” In 1941, The Moody Bible Institute played a key role in the formation of the NAE. According to Rick Meisel, John MacArthur has served on the Board of Trustees of the Moody Bible Institute. [118](#).

In "The Voice of Calvary Legacy," John MacArthur also stated that his father "helped establish the Hollywood Christian group, an outreach to people in the film and television industries. Jack MacArthur counted Roy Rogers and Dale Evans, who came to Christ under his preaching, as close personal friends." Since Henrietta Mears is credited with founding The Hollywood Christian Group, one can assume that John MacArthur's father, Jack MacArthur, "who helped establish the Hollywood Christian Group," was her friend and co-worker.

"Everything we know of the ministry of Billy Graham from the late 1940s on – the massive stadium events, the evangelistic movies, the radio programs, the counseling of presidents and kings – hinged on a singular moment in history that took place at the California retreat center of Forest Home..."

"I visited Forest Home last year to get a fresh perspective on my grandfather's story, and I'm returning there next week to speak at their annual Summer Family Camp..."

"It was at this time that my discouraged grandfather reluctantly accepted the invitation of Henrietta Mears to visit and speak at a Christian retreat center called Forest Home. Mears had worked at First Baptist Church in Minneapolis for Pastor Riley, who was also my grandfather's predecessor at Northwestern, and she was a very well-known and godly woman. She would end up having a huge impact in Hollywood, Calif., as she served as the director of Christian Education at First Presbyterian Church of Hollywood. She took grief for inviting him to speak because he was not part of the camp's denomination, but God had a plan in all of this..."

"The resulting change did not go unnoticed. The next day my granddaddy spoke at Forest Home, and 400 people made a commitment to Christ. Henrietta Mears remarked that he "preached with authority" that she hadn't seen before from him..."

"This was August 1949, and mere weeks later Billy Graham would go on to hold the historic 1949 Los Angeles Crusade in the tent erected on the corner of Washington and Hill Streets..."

-- *This is Billy Graham and Harold Ockenga, both friends of Henrietta Mears, working together. Henrietta Mears, friend of Jack MacArthur, motivated Graham and friends, and then commissioned them in 1947 and after:*

Harold Ockenga – (excerpts from this article)

“He was with Fuller from 1947-1954 as president, and then as a trustee from 1959-63. He was also **Director of the Christian Freedom Foundation** and a member of President Truman's Clergymen's Mission to Europe in 1947. He taught at Henrietta Mears's Forest Home Christian Conference Center...”

“Besides being first President and co-founder of Fuller Theological Seminary, Harold Ockenga was, along with J. Edwin Orr, Co-Founder of the **National Association of Evangelicals** in 1942. He served as President of both the National Association of Evangelicals and the World Evangelical Fellowship, which are merely the national and world organizations of the same thing. *Christianity Today* which was the New Evangelicalism report, had its birth in 1956 as the brainchild of Billy Graham and his father-in-law, Dr. L. Nelson Bell. Dr. Ockenga was Chairman of the Board from 1956-1985. In 1966, he was one of three featured speakers at the World Congress on Evangelism...”

“Dr. Ockenga also helped found **Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary** ><http://www.gcts.edu/> > in 1969 and was President of it and Gordon College from 1969-1985. “The Conwell School of Theology and Gordon Divinity School merged in 1969 through the efforts of philanthropist [J. Howard Pew](#), Dr. Harold J. Ockenga and Dr. Billy Graham...Dr. Ockenga, the long-time pastor of Boston's historic Park Street Church, became the new institution's first president. Dr. Ockenga retired in 1979 but maintained an active emeritus relationship with the school and served as member of the Board of Trustees until his death in 1985” Dr. Billy Graham is Chairman Emeritus of the Board of Trustees. (Ockenga was among other things also: Trustee Gordon College, Boston. Trustee Suffolk University, 1939-1949. Board directors Billy Graham Evangelical Association. President Truman's Clergymen's Mission to Europe, 1947, VP World Evangelical Fellowship since 1951; Director of Billy Graham Association.)

Henrietta Mears – (excerpts from the same article)

Henrietta presented her theology as "the Cause of Christ," which meant winning the world to Christ and establishing Christianity as the guiding force in society [reconstructionist theology] through evangelization of the world. The Fellowship of the Burning Heart, established by Mears at Forest Home, was where she encouraged her students to be willing to die for "the Cause of Christ." She laid her hands on them to receive her mantle, hence, receiving within themselves a "burning heart."

In 1947 she gave a speech at The Forest Home which resulted in motivating and calling what were later called the "acceptable anointed evangelists" namely **Billy Graham, Richard Halverson, Bill Bright** and several others...”

-- *Billy Graham was on the Board of Trustees, with Harold Ockenga, at Fuller Seminary and Rick Warren received his Doctorate in Ministry from Fuller Seminary.*

“John MacArthur’s father was the Director of Fuller Evangelistic Foundation. Charles Fuller, the founder of the Fuller Evangelistic Foundation, also cofounded Fuller Theological Seminary and the National Association of Evangelicals (NAE). Charles Fuller co-founded the NAE with J Edwin Orr and Harold Ockenga, the first President of the NAE (1942-44), and the first President of Fuller Seminary in 1947...”

“In 1951, the NAE revived the World Evangelical Fellowship (WEF) from the “dying embers” of the former World Evangelical Alliance (Evangelical Alliance of 1846) which became the NAE’s international umbrella. As previously stated, the Evangelical Alliance, now called the World Evangelical Alliance (WEA), was formed in 1846 in a conference held at Freemason’s Hall, United Grand Lodge of England, the mother of all Masonic lodges. 3....”
